WHAT ARE CHROMEBOOKS FOR??

School appropriate material only - relating to context of classes.



GOOGLE DRIVE

Your Google Drive and any and all documents saved in the drive or created in the drive are property of VPrep and will be monitored and MUST be school related.




CHAT CONDUCT

Chats must be related to school and are to be monitored by school personnel, a student may not use chat to share content that is not school related.


DO NOT DO THE FOLLOWING:

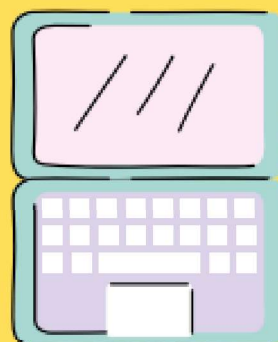


- Obtain, view, download, share materials that are illegal, obscene, pornographic, abusive, or objectionable

FILTERING & MONITORING



All VPrep Chromebooks are monitored using GoGuardian and Filters are in place to block inappropriate content. If a student is searching, viewing, creating, or using inappropriate material reports are sent to Administration. These are then forwarded to parents and can lead to disciplinary actions if needed.
