A Message from the Head of School

The weather is changing and school is in full swing I want to remind everyone of the importance of good attendance. Showing up to school and engaging in school work and with teachers has a huge impact on your student's academic achievement. You as a parent play a key role in helping your student develop a schedule that will keep them engaged and logged into their learning. Did you know that students who miss more than 9 days of school a year are engaged, successful, and on track to graduate? Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of a school year, can affect a student's academic success. VPrepWA is taking an active role in helping you keep your students engaged. You will be receiving email notifications when your student misses 3 full days of school, 5 full days of school, and after 7 full days, we are asking that you meet with your student's Principal to help us provide an opportunity to make changes that will reduce absences. Remember students who aren't able to attend live lessons can view recordings to make up missed attendance and can also work asynchronously during the weekends when they miss time during the school day. The flexibility of VPREP can help students stay engaged and find success when they haven't in other school settings. If your student is going to miss class time please be sure to communicate that with teachers and our Attendance Office attendance@vprepwa.org so that we can ensure they get what they need while not in attendance. Excused attendance doesn't excuse work, but will allow teachers to know they need to provide support for a student when they return or before they leave. Look for more information on attendance via your email at the end of the month.
