## **A Message from the Head of School**

State Testing is April 21 – 25 some things to remember to make the testing successful this school year!

For a successful testing experience:

- Report to the assigned test site at 8:30 am to ensure enough time to complete testing in one day.
- Bring with you a Picture ID for both student and parent - previous student ID card, Birth Certificate, Driver's License, state-issued ID
- Sign in and out student. The guardian must accompany the student to the testing site to sign the student in and out each day. If you will not be able to sign student in/out please contact Amy Miller for waiver at [amiller@vprepwa.org](mailto:amiller@vprepwa.org).
- Testing Time – The length of testing times will vary for all students, but students must be picked up at 3:30 pm daily. Once a student has completed all the tests required, they can leave and are not required to return.
- School-Issued Computer - Bring your Chromebook (fully charged) with your power cord, if you do not have a school-issued computer we will have a few on-site.
- Headphones - Bring your headset (cannot be wireless) if you have them, otherwise we will provide earbuds.
- Snacks & Water - Pack a hearty snack for your student to eat during breaks; they may not eat in the test room or during testing. Students need to bring a water bottle as water will not be supplied during testing. Please do not pack nut items in consideration of those with allergies. If your student has a food allergy, please alert the site staff when you drop him/her off.
- Lunch - Students will be given a 30-minute lunch from 12:00 – 12:30 and will NOT be supervised during that time. Guardians are asked to return during that time to take students to lunch or sit with them in a commons area during lunch.
- Night Before – Be sure to get a good night's sleep prior to testing and remind students to do their best. Ensure that you have the site location, campus maps if needed, parking passes if needed, and Chromebook is charging for tomorrow's test.

We look forward to seeing students in Grades 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 10th, and 11th at their testing site on the specific date sent before Spring Break. If you have questions, please reach out to your student's advisor, Principal, or Head of Schools.
