STATE TESTING UPDATE

Our State Testing Sites are set, and we have communicated via email information about Testing Location, Dates, and Times. Please check your emails for letters with information. We have also assigned a new Course Card in Canvas for your students for State Testing that will provide general information about and will show on your students' Canvas Dashboard.

If a testing date does not work for you, please communicate directly with Amy Miller amiller@vprepwa.org so she can look at other options.

Testing will be scheduled for one day during the week of April 27th - May 1st. and if a student needs more time to complete the test, the staff at the site will let you know what date to return (usually the next day).

Frequently Asked Questions:

- When should we arrive for testing?**
Testing begins at 8:00 AM. Please plan to arrive a little early to allow time for parking, finding the testing building, and signing your child in.
- What if we can't arrive by 8:00 AM?**
That's okay. Students may join during scheduled breaks throughout the day. Your testing site will share the specific break times.
- I can't find the testing building. What should I do?**
Check your site's Canvas Course Card. The site lead's name, phone number, and email are listed there and they can help guide you to the correct location.
- Can I stay in the room while my child is testing?**
No. Only trained, certified staff are allowed in testing rooms during state assessments.
- Does this test matter?**
Yes. State assessments show what students have learned during the school year. For high school students, some tests may count toward graduation pathway requirements.
- Is lunch provided?**
No. Please send a packed lunch or plan to drop lunch off during your child's lunch break.
- What does lunch look like during testing week?**
Lunch is from 12:00–12:30 PM. Students are not supervised during lunch. Guardians should return at that time to take students to lunch or sit with them in a commons area.
- How long do the tests take?**
Testing time varies by student. Estimated times are:
 - ELA CAT: about 60 minutes
 - ELA Performance Task: 120–180 minutes
 - Math CAT: about 60 minutes
 - Math Performance Task: about 60 minutes
 - Science (Grades 5, 8, and 11): about 120 minutes
- What happens if my child finishes early?**
A staff member will contact you when your child is finished and ready to be picked up.
- If my child finishes all tests in one day, do they need to return another day?**
No. Once all state testing is complete, your child does not need to return to the testing site.
- What will students do after they finish testing for the week?**
Students will continue working on assigned classwork and will also complete their i-Ready Reading and Math diagnostic tests.

CNEEB

Thank you for your partnership and for being part of our school community. Please complete the Child Nutrition Eligibility and Education Benefit (CNEEB) application for your student.

Completing the CNEEB is important because it helps ensure VPAWA receives full State of Washington funding to continue offering vital supports like small groups, LAP, credit recovery, and summer school for credit recovery. When families complete the form and qualify, students may also be eligible for Summer Bucks (Summer EBT) and reduced fees for other programs and activities, including SAT and ACT testing fees. 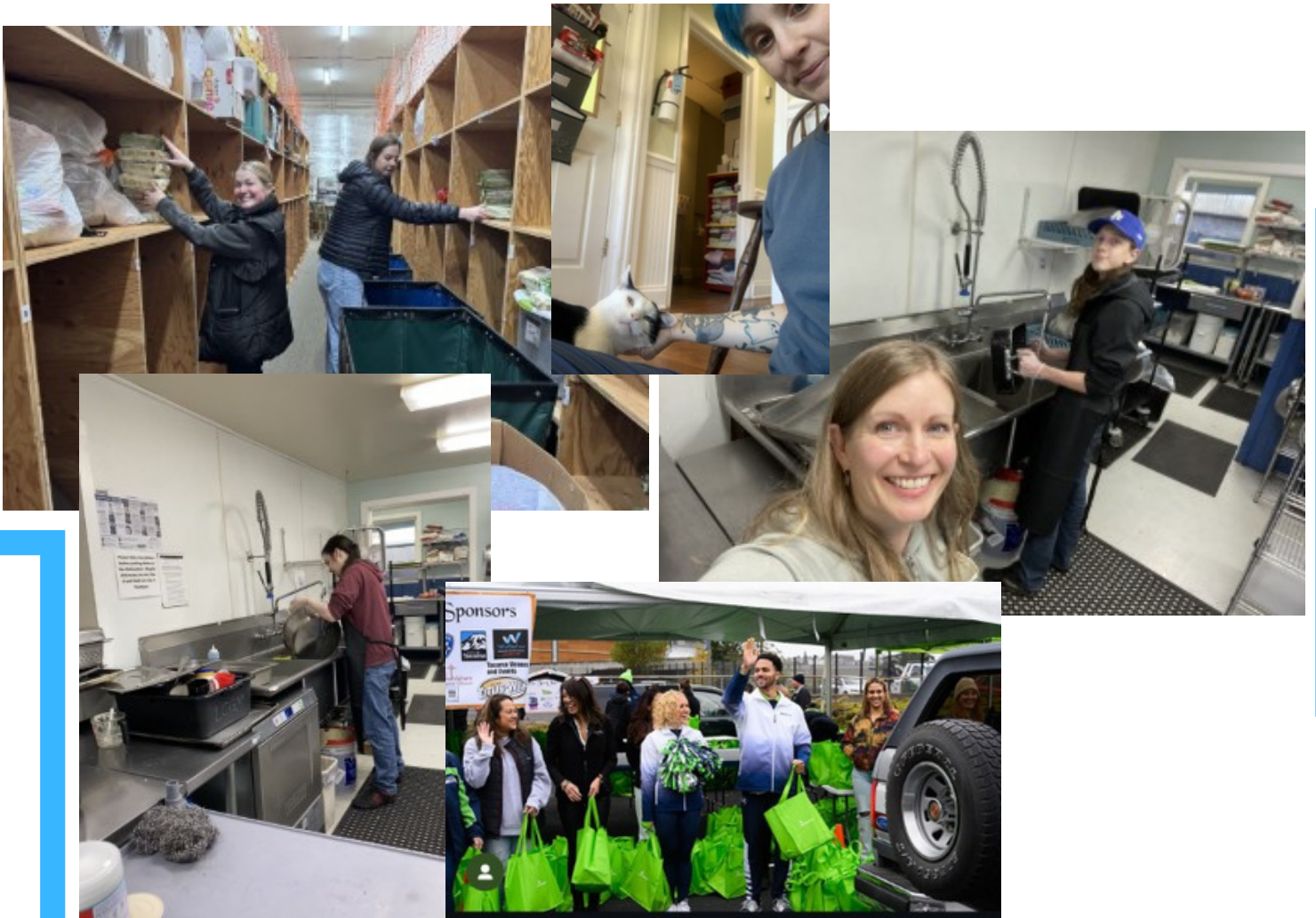
